

Unit History, 1 thru 31 January 1948

The 13th Bombardment Squadron (Light) was activated at Kelly Field, Texas on 25 August 1917. During its 30 1/2 years of existence, it has been designated as 104th Aero Squadron, 13th Attack Squadron and 13th Bombardment Squadron (L), its present designation. (1)

Due to the fact that the Army hadn't firmly gotten on its feet during the early part of the first World War, the matter of organization was rather hap-hazard. Men were assigned to squadrons without regard to their qualifications. At Kelly Field on 25 August 1917, the enlisted men were lined up and after the first one hundred fifty men had been counted off, they were named the 104th Aero Squadron and assigned as such. This first squadron was commanded by Lt Carson with Sergeant Pearce as First Sergeant. (1)

This Squadron went overseas in December 1917 and returned to the United States in June 1919.

The 104th disembarked at Liverpool, England and was assigned to English flying schools. The relation between English officers and men and the Americans was exceptionally good. During this time, the mechanics were working on Camels, Pups, Avros, SE-5's Rolls Royce, DH-6 Handley Page and B.E. two engine planes. History has it that these mechanics could remove an engine from a plane at the end of the day and have it ready for flight the next morning. In July, 1918, the squadron was moved to France, where they stayed until returning to the United States, June 1919. (1)

After the return of the 104th Aero Squadron from overseas, the organization was almost completely depleted by the wholesale discharge of enlisted men and officers.

The 13th Squadron (redesignated as such in March 1921) was placed on inactive status on 20 June 1924 and remained on that status until 17 November 1929.


- 3. The Squadren flying hours are higher again this month-as of 26 January 1948, we have 593:00 flying hours. This was due to good weather and excellent line maintenance.

T/sgt. Bell and Pfc. Ricks have been added to the Engineering Section and at present are working on A-26 aircraft.


