- 2. As of the date of this report there are twenty six(26) Pilots flying with the organization, four(4) of which are attached. There are thirteen (13) Bombardiers and Navigators flying with the Squadron. Of the twenty-six Pilots, twenty three (23) are combat ready and three (30) are in advanced crew.
- 3. The Squadron flew a total of 619:45 for the month. All Pilots are well ahead of the yearly minimums required by AF Reg 60-2. Ninety percent of the pilots completed their monthly instrument & night flying requirements.
- 4. Bombardier Training was stressed for the month, but with bad weather and unforseen Engineerying problems only three Bombardiers completed dropping their six months bomb requirements. All Bombardiers however, have completed their ground school and have received one hour of bomb trainer training per week.

5. Much of the total time for the month was flown during classified missions with only one simulated combat mission flown during the month. 6. Capt Parry L Thomas received his Senior Pilot rating this month. 7. Capt Gerald K Hannaford received his white instrument card this month. 8. 

Attached hereto is the Unit History for the 13th Bombardment Squadron (L), 3rd Bombardment Group (L), APO 328 for the period of 1 Sept through 30 Sept 1949. 2. During the month of September the Squadron was occupied for the majority of the time with normal training activities and routine patrol work. Exceptions to the norm however, occurred when the squadron participsted in the celebration of Fifth Air Force Day on 20 September, in an aerial review on 26 September, and in the practice of chemical warfare attack in the latter days of the month. The following is a summary of all major personnel changes in the squadron for the month of September, abstracted from the morning report. 1 Sept One officer transferred to Hq 3d Bomb Group (L). 2 Sept Two airmen returned to ZI, one for reassignment and one for discharge. 10 Sept One airmen returned to ZI for discharge. 11 Sept One airmen discharged while in ZI on emergency furlough. 12 Sept One officer transferred into squadron. 13 Sept One officer transferred to Hq 19th Bomb Wg, APO 334. 16 Sept Three airmen transferred into squadron. 24 Sept One airmen returned to ZI for discharge. 26 Sept One officer returned to ZI for reassignment. 
- 4. The 3rd Bombardment Group (L) joined the rest of Yokota Air Force Base in extending an open house invitation via Radio Station WVFR to all occupation personnel. The 13th Bombardment Squadron supplied aircraft to similate attacks on the field and thus provide a target for fighter interception. Personnel of the squadron were also present on the flight line to act as guides to visitors.
- 5. On Sunday, 25 September, aircraft of the 13th Bombardment Squadron in conjunction with those of the 8th and 90th Bombardment Squadrons, departed Yokota AFB, for Komaki AFB to participate in an acrial review. The formation staged out of Komaki on the following day under the command of Lt. Col. Payne the Group Commander. Target time was briefed as 1202:15 hours and the actual time on target was 1202:30.
- 6. In the last week of the month the squadron practiced chemical attack tactics for the first time in several months. N-10 chemical tanks were used with water as the filler rather than any actual chemical agent. The similated attacks were made on the east side of the Yokota AFB runway and were, for the most part, highly successful.
- 7. Outside of scheduled activities, squadron personnel put in a considerable amount of time and effort into extra-military activities which reflected credit upon the squadron. Ten men from the 13th Squadron are on the Yokota AFB football squad, with Captain Spencer of the Materiel Section coaching the team.
- 8. Within the squadron a photographic darkroom has been organized and many of the people of the squadron spend quite a bit of time there doing various types of photographic work.
- 9. The personnel of the squadron held a squadron picnic at the Yekota Officer's Club annex on the morning of Fifth Air Force Day. Several teams of officer's and airmen participated in various sports. Quantities of beer and coca cola were consumed and an excellent meal was prepared by the 3rd Food Service Squadron and thoroughly enjoyed by all. Of necessity the picnic was ended early to facilitate the early return of the officer's of the squadron to Yekota that they might act as guides during the celebration and open house at the base.

- 1. Attached hereto is the Unit History for the 13th Bombardment Squadron (L), 3d Bombardment Group (L), APO 328 for the period of 1 October 1949 through 31 October 1949.

The aircraft maintenance can be scheduled a month or two in advance within limits, and it is the intention of the section to time their maintenance so that the maximum amount of flying time will be available during the week of the ONT. The Administrative Section has been bringing all of the records up to date, and with the visit be the 5th Air Force Classification and Audit Team, the records should be in excellent shape by the time the inspecting team reaches us.

- g. Although major efforts of our section are being directed toward changing accounts, the forest has not been hid by the trees, many improvements are concurrently being worked out. For example, the hand receipts for the tool kits were revised and through the efforts of Lt.
