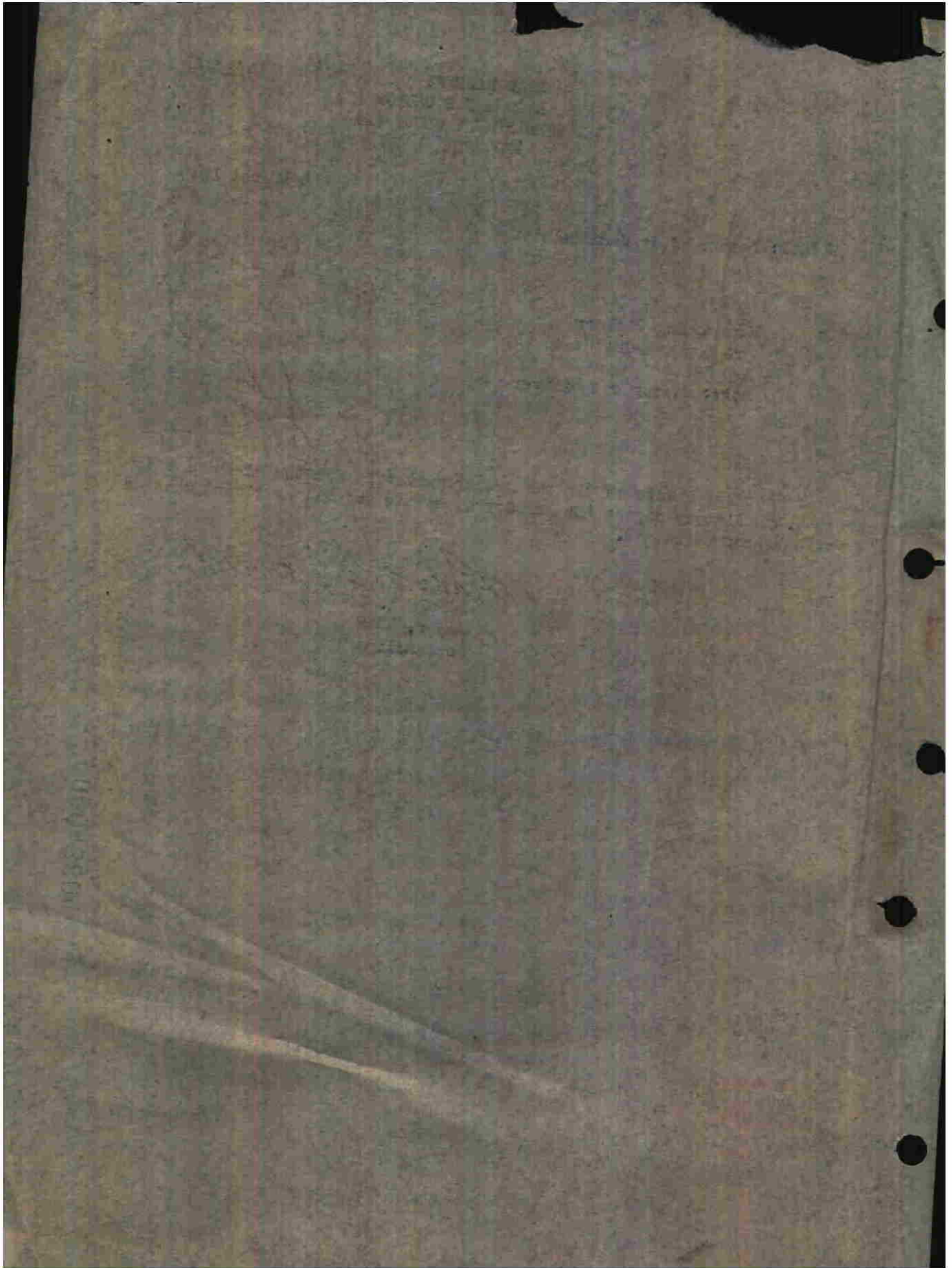

3. Activities:

The majority of the squadron's activities this month were in preparation for and in the successful completion of a two week field maneuver. The first two weeks of the month were spent by all sections preparing their equipment and personnel for movement to the maneuver area. However, despite these preparation activities flying was not neglected and during this two week period a total of one hundred and seventy five (175) hours were flown.

The Material Section, under Capt R.V. Spencer, spent the preparation period performing as much maintenance as was possible in advance of the maneuvers, so that the number of aircraft upon which major inspections and repairs would be necessary would be held at a minimum.

During the two week period that the squadron spent on maneuvers at Hamamatsu Airbase, a total of 615:55 hours were flown. Although the aircraft were evacuated twice because of the threatened approach of typhoons, the weather remained exceptionally fine during the entire two week period. Several successful rocket, bombing and gunnery missions were flown, as well as several simulated strikes against military objectives.

Altogether, the maneuvers were highly successful; both in the number of hours flown and in the manner in which the missions were executed. All sections in the squadron did their jobs in an exemplary manner, and with the exception of one aircraft accident (covered in the Operations Report) no mishaps occurred while in the field.

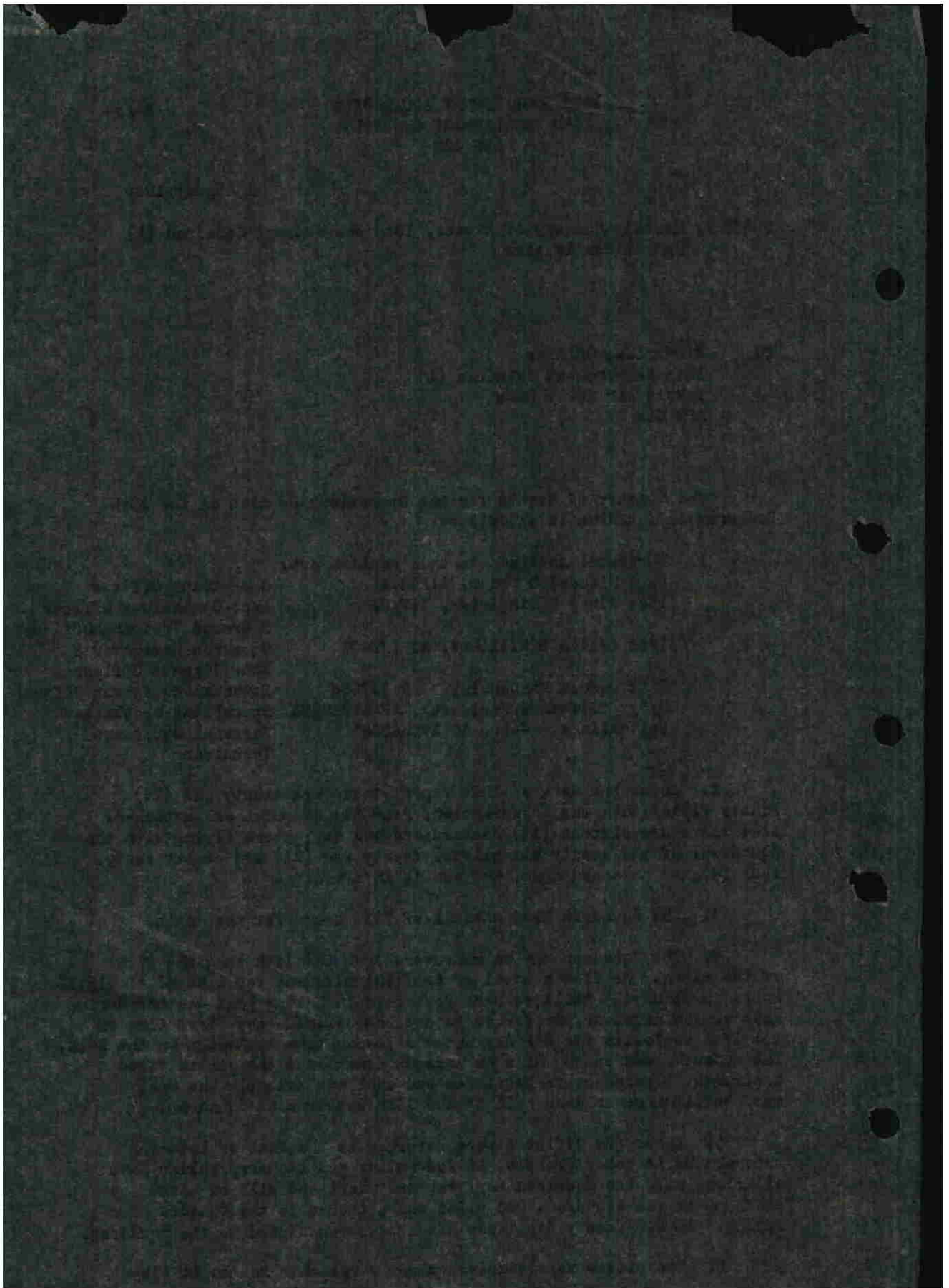
2. As of the date of this report there are twenty six (26) Pilots flying with the organization, four (4) of which are attached. Also there are sixteen (16) Bombardiers and Navigators flying with the Squadron. Of the twenty six pilots, twenty one (21) are combat ready, four (4) are Advanced Gunners, and one is in training.

3. The Squadron flew a total of 792 hours for the month.

4. The Squadron was on maneuvers from the 14th thru the 27th of the month. We flew a total of ten (10) missions for a total of 615:55 hours in 14 days. While we were fortunate in having good weather during most of the maneuvers, we forced to abort twice, the first time on the 17th to Yokota for the day and the second time to Kadena on the 20th. The maneuvers were ended while we were at Kadena and the pilots filed instrument clearances to Yokota to end what was probably the most successful maneuver ever held by the 18th Bombardment Squadron.

5. Three (3) Officers were returned to the Line of Interior this month. Lt Robert Temple, Lt Ted Smith, and Lt Harry Miller have all flown with the Squadron for over two years and will be missed by everyone in the Squadron. One pilot was attached to the Squadron for flying. Lt Sam Crosby from Base Flight was reassigned to the Squadron.

6. Two pilots received their award cards this month. Lt Floyd



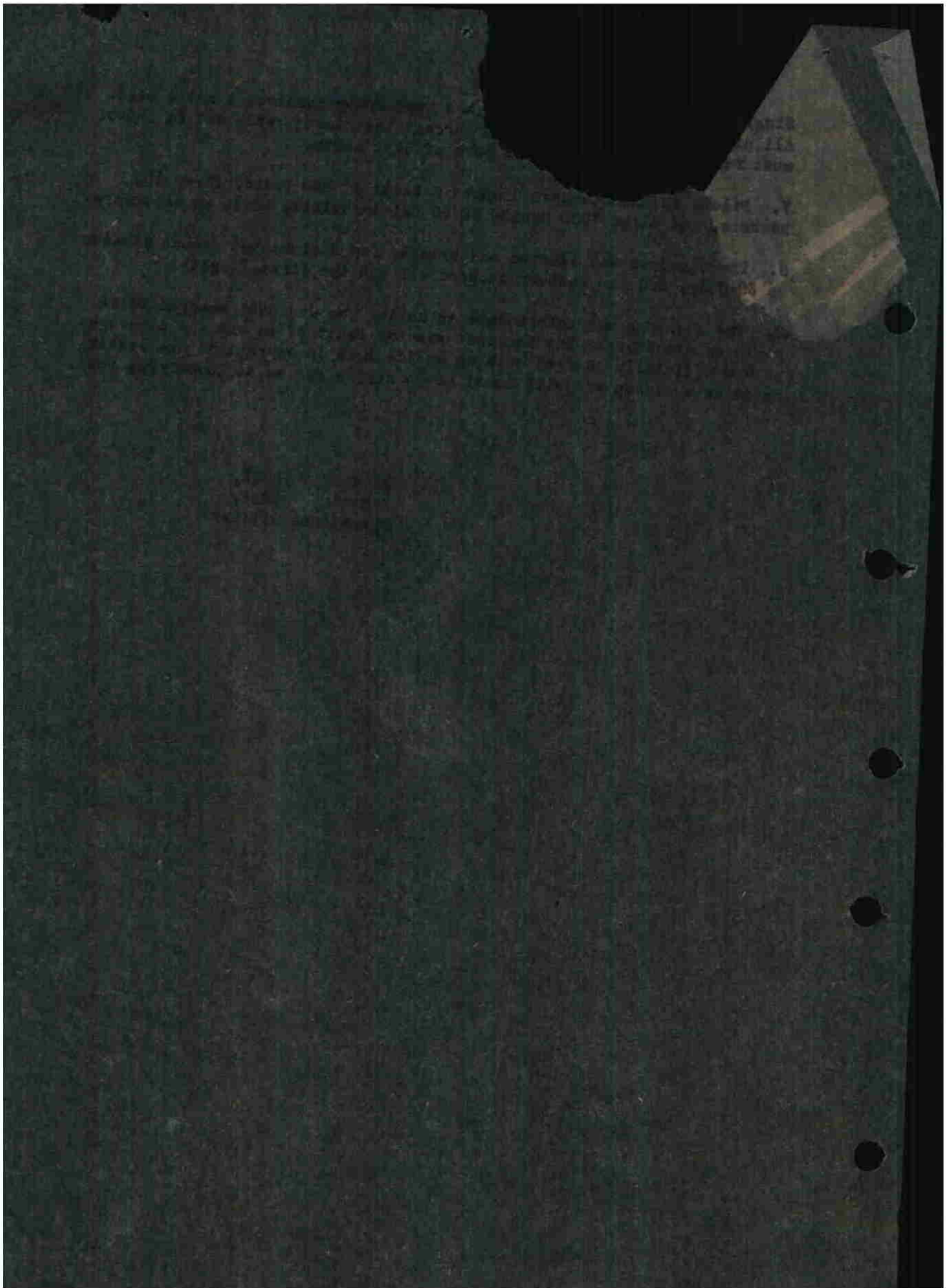
and Capt Price received a white card.

4. The 3rd Bombardment Group (L) joined the rest of Yokota Air Force Base in extending an open house invitation via Radio Station WYTR to all occupation personnel. The 13th Bombardment Squadron supplied aircraft to simulate attacks on the field and thus provide a target for fighter interception. Personnel of the squadron were also present on the flight line to act as guides to visitors.

5. On Sunday, 25 September, aircraft of the 13th Bombardment Squadron in conjunction with those of the 8th and 90th Bombardment Squadrons, departed Yokota AFB, for Komaki AFB to participate in an aerial review. The formation staged out of Komaki on the following day under the command of Lt. Col. Payne the Group Commander. Target time was briefed as 1202:15 hours and the actual time on target was 1202:30.


6. In the last week of the month the squadron practiced chemical attack tactics for the first time in several months. M-10 chemical tanks were used with water as the filler rather than any actual chemical agent. The simulated attacks were made on the east side of the Yokota AFB runway and were, for the most part, highly successful.

7. Outside of scheduled activities, squadron personnel put in a considerable amount of time and effort into extra-military activities which reflected credit upon the squadron. Ten men from the 13th Squadron are on the Yokota AFB football squad, with Captain Spencer of the Materiel Section coaching the team.

8. Within the squadron a photographic darkroom has been organized and many of the people of the squadron spend quite a bit of time there doing various types of photographic work.

9. The personnel of the squadron held a squadron picnic at the Yokota Officer's Club annex on the morning of Fifth Air Force Day. Several teams of officer's and airmen participated in various sports. Quantities of beer and coca cola were consumed and an excellent meal was prepared by the 3rd Food Service Squadron and thoroughly enjoyed by all. Of necessity the picnic was ended early to facilitate the early return of the officer's of the squadron to Yokota that they might act as guides during the celebration and open house at the base.

1. Attached hereto is the Unit History for the 13th Bombardment Squadron (L), 3d Bombardment Group (L), APO 328 for the period of 1 October 1949 through 31 October 1949.
2. The month of October was spent in preparing for the annual inspection by USAF to determine the Operational Readiness of the organization. The squadron participated in a low level attack on Okinawa on the 20th of October, and has been flying gunnery, rocket, and bombing missions every day in an attempt to raise the proficiency level of the pilot and crew. The Maintenance Section has been working doubly hard in an attempt to schedule the work load during the period 28 November through 2 December. The aircraft maintenance can be scheduled a month or two in advance within limits, and it is the intention of the section to time their maintenance so that the maximum amount of flying time will be available during the week of the OBT. The Administrative Section has been bringing all of the records up to date, and with the visit by the 5th Air Force Classification and Audit Team, the records should be in excellent shape by the time the inspecting team reaches us.
3. The following is a summary of all major personnel changes in the squadron for the month of October, abstracted from the morning report:

The assistance of the 3d Installations Squadron in completing our much needed work order requests is greatly appreciated.

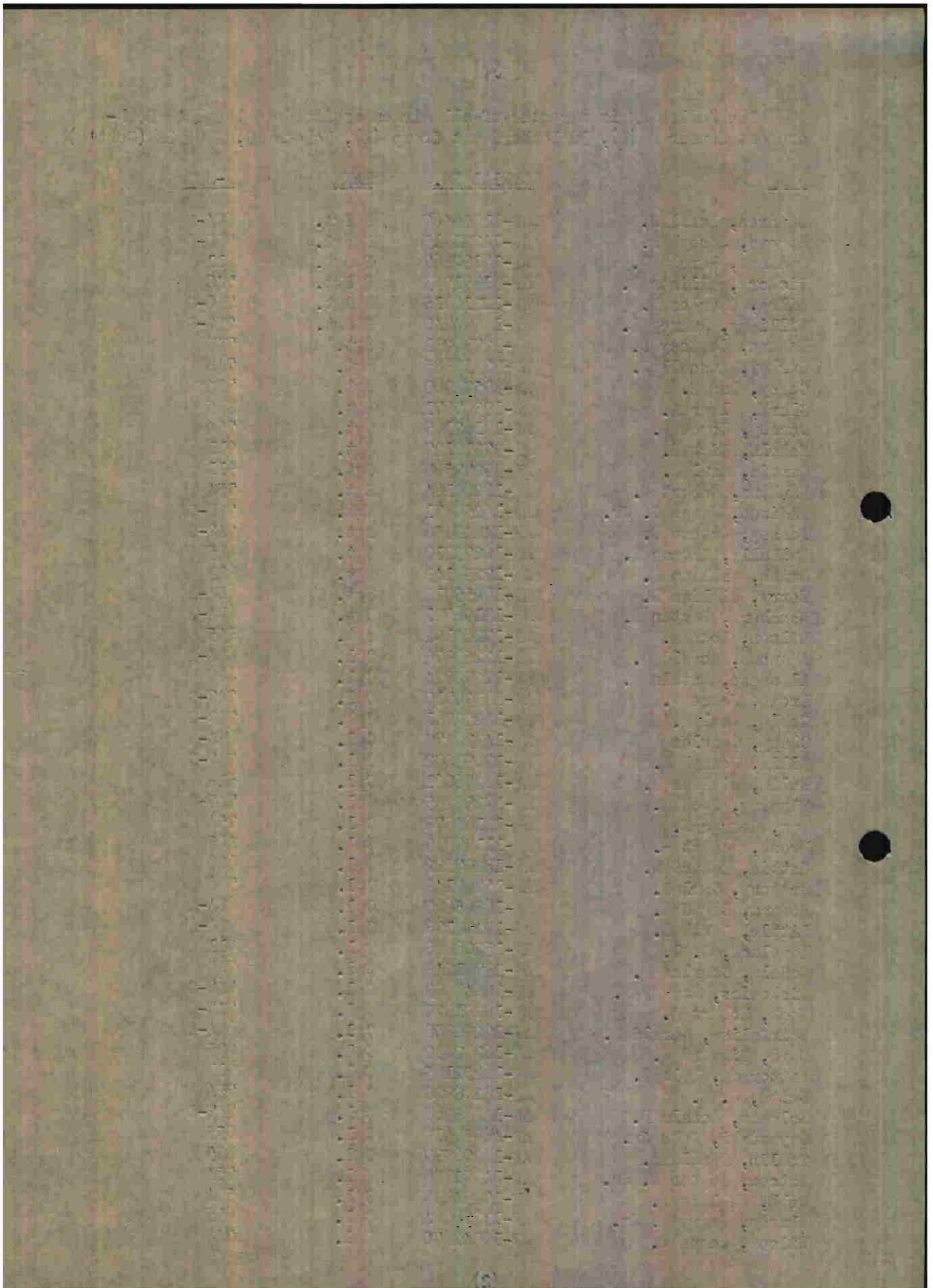

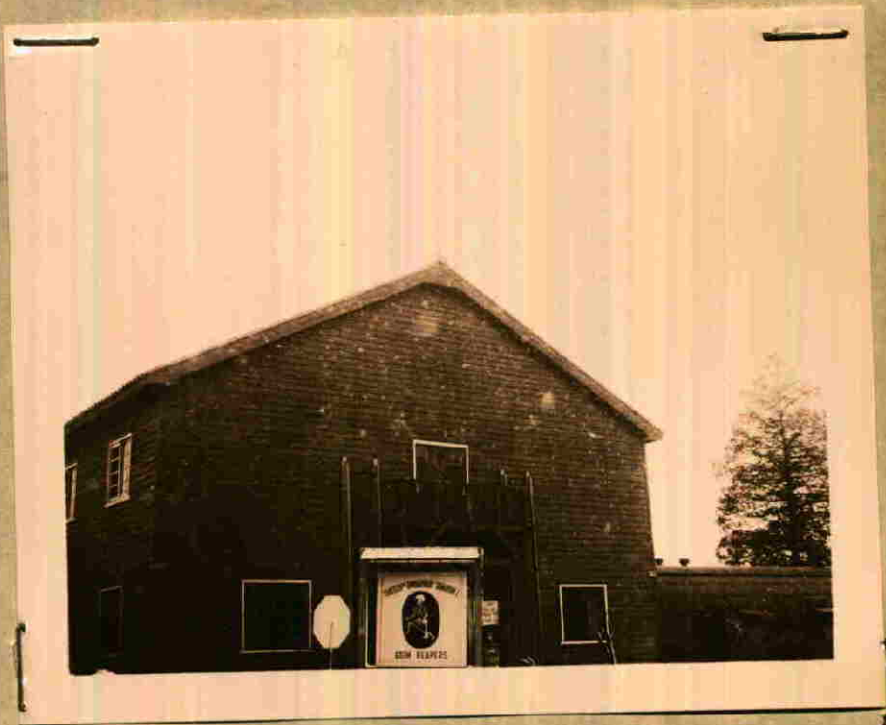
