SECTION II

MAJOR ACTIVITIES:

1. The "Pair-a-dice" Squadren flew a total of 366 hours and 40 minutes during the menth of April, with 19 assigned B-26 aircraft.

Operations personnel estimate that the figure would have been closer to 500 hours if the squadren had not been on a stand-by status for at least two out of the four weeks, awaiting orders on various command missions of one type or another. The maintenance section found it necessary to held flyable aircraft on the ground in order to meet committments for the command missions. This situation reduced combat training, such as gunnery and bombing missions to the ranges, to a minimum. However, 15 missions were flown to Mite and Onehara Shima ranges with the one assigned B-26C (glassed nese) on medium altitude bombing missions in conjunction with the Base Bombardiers School.

One Group mission was flown during the month, with the 90th furnishing 9 of the proposed 18 aircraft. One of our 9 ships aborted after about 1 hour of flying because of a rough engine. (See intelligence report in appendix). It. Col. Payne, the Group Commanding Officer, led the Group, while 1st Lt. Thomas A. Todd, Squadron Operations Officer led the squadron.

A subject about which the 90th speaks with pride...though we still knock on wood when talking about it...is our flying safety record. As this unit history is being compiled, the squadron has passed the 12,000 hour mark without having had a major accident; and only one minor taxi accident. These hours have been flown during the past 21 months, and the record can probably be contributed partly to luck, but most certainly to flying safety consciousness on the parts of the aircrew who fly the ships and the maintenance people who keep 'em flying.

2. The 90th underwent at least two inspections during the month from higher headquarters. Captain Wright from USAF Headquarters made a general inspection of the maintenance section. The exact purpose of his inspection and the results have not been made known to this historical efficer.

Cel. Scattergood of 314th Air Division conducted a stand-by combat crew and line inspection on the 23rd of April. Crew training and maintenance were his special subjects.

3. At the end of the month the squadron ended up with 19 B-26 air-craft. Four were assigned from the inactivated 38th Bomb. Group at Itami AFB, and one Tow-Target TB-26 was ferried up from 20th Air Force at Guam. This squadron dispatched a ferry crew to Guam for that purpose. (See appendix).

- 1. This headquarters has received numerous reports of survey covering parachutes on which various methods were used to compute therrecommended pecuniary charge. In the Majority of cases, the recommended chare represented the invoice or catalogue price since such price represented the cost of replacement of a similar item. It is the opinion of this headquarters that the amount charged for lost property should be the value to the Government at time of loss. The computation of such value is normally the invoice or catalogue price less depreciation for usage. Section II, TM 14-904.
- 2. In order to assist commanders in determining depreciation and to establish a uniform standard for computation of value of parachutes, this head-quarters has determined that for the purpose of computing unit value on reports of survey and statements of charges, parachutes will be considered as subject to depreciation at the rate of 14% per year or major fraction thereof but not to exce exceed 80% of invoice or catalogue price. This standard is based on a seven year life expectancy of a parachute and consideration of average salvage sale walue of a like condemned article.
- 3. The annual depreciation percentage as outlined in paragraph 2 should be considered as the standard or norm and may be increased or decreased in accordance with unusual circumstances pertaining to the extent and nature of use to which the parachute has been subjected and its condition immediately prior to loss or destruction.
 - 4. It is requested that the information contained herein be disseminated to appropriate installations and activities under jurisdiction of your command.




- 1. Reference FAF SOP 15-41, dated 20 January 1948; FAF SOP 15-41A, dated 21 October 1948; FAF Reg. 15-41, dated 20 January 1948; AF Reg. 20-8, dated 23 August 1945; and FEAF Reg. 210-1, dated 19 May 1948.
- 2. Histories for the month of January through April 1949 will be submitted to this headquarters, through proper channels, in accordance with the above cited regulations, to reach this headquarters not later than 10 May 1949.
- 3. Effective 1 May 1949, the above references are cancelled, and each organization will submit to this headquarters, through channels, those supporting documents mentioned in paragraphs 4 and 5 of AF Reg. 210-3, dated 14 December 1948, in quadruplicate, along with a very short narrative explaining the documentary evidence, so as to arrive at this headquarters not later than the 10th day of the month subsequent to the month covered. All material will be consolidated in this headquarters monthly, and one annual history compiled by the Fifth Air Force Historical Officer.
- 4. All commanding officers will assist in furnishing historical personnel with data of historical value, whether or not current, and regardless of classification, so that the accomplishment of a comprehensive, analytical record of the Fifth Air Force experiences may be recorded.
- 5. This letter will serve as authority for furnishing historical data to this headquarters, as mentioned in paragraph 3 above, until such time as a new Fifth Air Force directive is published.
- 6. The above information will be transmitted to all units in your command.
