





PFO 65A-12. In the afternoon of March 6 1945, nine A-20Gs flew to the Cagayan River Valley area of Northern Luzon to attack Jap troops in Lal-lo Town. 14 x 100 lb napalm bombs and 80 x 100 lb parademos were dropped on the town and 12,550 x .50 caliber rounds of ammunition were expended strafing the target. Several houses were destroyed by the fire bombs and the stone church was damaged. Meager, light A/A came from Lal-lo Town, holing one A-20.

FFO 68A-8. Early in the morning of 9 March 1945, three A-20Gs flew to the Lake Tasl area of Southern Luzon to support ground troops. "Curless", the ground station, ordered the squadron to attack a ridge west of the river at Ternate. 6 x 100 lb napalm bombs and 30 x 100 lb parademos were dropped on the ridge and the target was strafed with $6,320 \times .50$ caliber rounds of amunition. Definite results of the stack were generally unobserved.

FFO 68a-9. In the middle of the morning of 9 March 1945, three a-20Gs flew to the Lake Taal area of Southern Luzon to support ground troops. "Curless", the ground station, ordered the airplanes to attack Jap artillery positions 1000 yards west of Cuenca. 6 x 250 lb delay demos and 30 x 100 lb parademos were dropped on the target designated by smoke bombs. All the bombs hit in the desired area with unobserved results and the target was strafed with 3,350 x .50 caliber rounds of ammunition.

FFO 63A-10. In the early afternoon of 9 March 1945, three A-20Gs took off from base to support ground troops in the Lake Taal area of Southern Luzon. "Curless", the ground station, ordered the simplenes to attack Jap troops in the Dampalit River Valley near Los Banos. 36 x 100 lb napalm bombs were dropped on the target designated by smoke shells, with generally unobserved results. The target was strafed with 6,500 x .50 caliber rounds of ammunition.

FFO 69a-6. On the morning of 10 March 1945, ten a-20Gs of this squadron took off from base to support the landing at Zamboanga, Mindanao, P.I. 18 x 250 lb delay demos and 36 x 250 lb parademos were dropped in the designated target which included an area between the wharf and the foothills. All the bombs hit in the target, destroying several huts and some supplies in Pasananca Town, but other results were generally unobserved. The target was strafed with 17,700 rounds of .50 caliber ammunition. Meager, inaccurate machine gun fire came from a unidentified position in Pasananca Town. Moderate, medium and inaccurate fire came from a gun position in target 16.

FFO 72A-9. On the morning of 13 March 1945, this squadron took off to hit Tanauan Village. Nine airplanes reached the target and dropped 18 x 250 lb bombs and 36 x 250 lb parademos, destroying three buildings, two nips buts and a motor vehicle. Several more buildings were damaged by bombs and strafing with 16,550 rounds of .50 caliber ammunition. The target was designated by the ground station, "Curless".

FFO 73a-11. Taking off at 1500/I on 14 March 1945, ten a-20s bombed and strafed Imoc Hill, buzon, dropping 18 x 250 lb demos, 36 x 250 lb parademos and expended 20,750 rounds of .50 caliber ammunition. Two huts were destroyed, a large oil fire was started and a machine gun position was silenced; other results were unobserved.

FFO 744-10. Another mission to Imos hill was ordered for 15 March 1945 so nine 4-20s took off at 1042/I and dropped 18 x 250 lb demos 30 x 250 lb parademos and expended 14,000 rounds of .50 caliber ammunition in strafing. Three buildings were destroyed by fire in San Marcos. One 4-20 received seven holes in the left wing from a probable bomb blast.

FFO 76A-15. Ten airplanes reached Guenca, the target designated by the ground station "Gurless", at 0940/I on 17 March 1945, and destroyed the church, school house and several other buildings including some very large houses in the center of town. One of the destroyed buildings burned flercely with smoke rising to 700 fest. There were several machine gun positions firing at our airplanes, holing one A-20 twice. Several jeeps and 6 x 6 trucks were seen headed toward Guenca on the road from Balibag. 20 x 250 lb demos and 39 x 250 lb parademos were dropped and 20,300 x .50 rounds of ammunition were expended in strafing.

FFO 77a-19. On 18 March 1945, six A-20s took off at 1130/I to support the landing at Iloilo, ranay, F.I. 12 x 250 lb demos, 30 x 100 lb demos and 11,650 rounds of .50 caliber ammunition were expended on Bacolod Strip and the vicinity of Fort San Fedro, destroying two sail boats. Thirty to forty unserviceable barges were strafed with nil apparent damage. Two probable serviceable locomotives and several box cars were seen at Mansaya.

FFO 78a-7. On March 19 1945, the squadron took off at 1030/I and flew to Iloilo, ranay again, with six A-20s, in support of ground troops. The C.S.a., "Magpie", ordered the airplanes to hit bacolod Strip, Negros. 12 x 250 lb demos and 24 x 250 lb parademos were dropped and 12,250 rounds of .50 caliber ammunition were expended.

FFO 79a-13. On 20 March 1945, six a-20s took off at 0730/I and flew to the Hoile area, ranay where "Nightshirt", the S.a.r., gave them Fanrica Airdrome area as a target. 12 x 250 lb demos and 24 x 250 lb parademos were dropped and 12,650 x .50 caliber rounds of ammunition were expended, starting a fire in a SSF and destroying a building. Two airplanes were heled by 40MM A/A and a K-22 camera was lost over the target.

PFO 30a-3. Ten a-20s hit Lipa Town on 21 March 1945 with 20 x 250 lb demos, 40 x 250 lb parademos and 12,000 rounds of .50 caliber ammunition, starting a large black-smoke fire in a building, destroyed two houses and damaged three vehicles. Propaganda leaflets were dropped on Lipa as ordered. Moderate, medium and inaccurate A/A fire came from several different positions in the target area. A burned a-20 was seen near the target.

FFO 81a-3. Taking off at 0715/I on 22 March 1945, three a-20s of this squadron flew to Cabu City, Cebu, with nine a-20s of the 13th Squadron. The three airplanes dropped 6 x 100 lb napalm bombs, 210 x 23 lb parafrags and expended 5,600 rounds of .50 caliber ammunition, destroying three buildings and damaging several others, starting a large fire and damaging four vehicles. Intense, light and accurate a/A was encountered by the airplanes of this squadron and medium a/A damaged one a-20 of the 13th Squadron. 30 x 23 lb parafrags were returned due to failure to release by the 90th Squadron.

FFO 31a-4. Three more A-20s of this scuadron flew with the 39th Squadron to Cebu on 22 March, taking off at 0725/I. The three airplanes made three three-ship passes from 5% to N2 over Talisay and Tanke Villages dropping 4 x 100 lb napalm bombs, 192 x 23 lb parafrags and expending 6,750 rounds of .50 caliber ammunition. Two buildings were set on fire and numerous other buildings were damaged. 1 x 100 lb napalm bomb and 48 x 23 lb parafrags were returned due to mechanical failure of the release mechanism.

FFO 81A-5. Also, on 22 March, this squadron had three A-20s flying with the 89th Squadron to Tayabas and Lucban on Luzon. Take-off time was 1200/1. 6 x 250 lb demos and 12 x 250 parademos were dropted and 5,900 rounds of .50 caliber rounds of ammunition were expended on the two towns, starting a large fire in a big building in Tayabas and damaging several buildings in Lucban. Any other damage could not be determined.

FFO S2a-5. Ten a-20s took off at 1200/I on 23 March to hit Candelaria Hill in the Lake Teal area, Luzon, in support of ground troops. 20 x 250 lb demos and 40 x 500 lb demos were dropped and 17,300 rounds of .50 caliber ammunition were expended, causing nil visible damage. rropaganda leaflets were dropped over the target area. Three a-20s from the 13th Squadron flew in the same formation and attacked the same target.

PFO 332-5. On 24 March 1945, this squadron coordinated its attack on Cebu City with the 39th Squadron, who led, and 8th Squadron. Take off was made at 1150/I. Eight airplanes reached the target, making one pass from NW to 32 over Cebu City, dropping 34 x 250 lb parademos, 13 x 100 lb napalm incendiaries and expending 11,600 rounds of .50 caliber ammunition. Two buildings were destroyed, several others damaged and numerous fires were started. Moderate machine gun fire was encountered. One plane made a second pass in order to release the two remaining wing bombs, but they failed to release and were returned to base.

FFO 84E-5. On the 25 March 1945, nine a-20s took off at 1215/I and flew to Cebu City, dropping 36 x 250 parademos, 18 x 100 lb napalm incendiaries and expending 10,250 rounds of .50 caliber ammunition. All nine planes made a second pass from NW to 5E over the city and three of the airplanes made a second pass from N to E. Several small fires were started, two buildings and a church were probably destroyed and a machine gun position probably silenced. Moderate and inaccurate machine gun fire was encountered. Propaganda leaflets were dropped.

FFO 852-4. Sapac was the target fro nine A-20s of this squadron on 26 March 1945. Take-off was at 0755/I. 18 x 100 lb napalm and 36 x 250 lb parademos were dropped and 16,950 rounds of .50 caliber ammunition were expended, destroying four buildings and damaging several others. Propaganda leaflets were dropped over the target. One airplane was holed by 20M. A/A fire from Lipa Airdrome.

FFO 865-4. Taking off at 1030/I on 27 March 1945, nine A-20s dropped 18 x 250 lb demos, 36 x 250 lb parademos and expended 18,000 rounds of .50 caliber ammunition, making two runs from SE to NW over the target, Dita Town. There was a large explosion in one building causing a fire with flames to 150 feet and several other buildings were destroyed. Meager machine gun fire was encountered, coming from the ME end of Dita Town. The original target, Tiaong Town, was not hit because the ground radio "Curless" ordered the squadron to hit Dita Town and designated the target by smoke shells dropped by an L-5. Ten parademos failed to explode.

FFO 27E-2. At 0900/I on 28 March, ten A-20s took off from Elmore Strip and flew to the Lake Taal area where they checked in with the ground radio "Curless" who referred them to "Cutlive" for a target. "Outlive" told the squadron to hit Lumbang Town, making their run from N to S. 20 x 250 lb demos and 39 x 250 lb parademos were dropped and 16,700 rounds of .50 caliber ammunition were expended, destroying the church and five other buildings, damaged several more buildings and left three fires burning in the town. Three airplanes were holed by M/G fire and 200M fire. Four parademos failed to explode.

FTO 882-3. Lucban was the target on 29 March 1945, when five a-20s of this squadron took off at 0800/I, carrying M10 napalm wing tanks for the first time, made an attack on the town. Ten M10 napalm wing tanks and 20 x 250 lb parademos were dropped and 9,500 rounds of .50 caliber ammunition were expended, destroying several buildings. A large two-story wooden barracks in the western end of town was completely destroyed with a direct hit by an M10 napalm wing tank, a large aerehouse was destroyed by another M10 tank, and six wooden buildings and nips buts were destroyed by other M10 tanks. Several buildings were damaged by bombs and fires were left burning in the town. Later, reports from the ground troops and guerrillas in that area stated that 20 trucks, 15 horses were destroyed by the M10 tanks and many Japs were killed. One wing tank was dropped safe, it failed to release over the target, and it did not explode. Approximately 100 Filipinos were seen on the outskirts of Luisiana waving at our airplanes.

FFO 892-6. Two missions were flown on 30 March 1945 to Negros Island in support of ground troops. Six a-20s took off at 0630/I and dropped 12 x 250 lb demos, 22 x 250 lb parademos and expended 9,250 rounds of .50 caliber ammunition on Murica Town, the target designated by the C.S.S, "Magpie". Two wooden buildings were destroyed, a black smoke fire was started and a black sedan was damaged by strafing. One airplane was holed by machine gun fire. Four tanks were seen near the milling company east of Bacolod. 2 x 250 lb parademos were returned due to failure of release mechanism. The second formation of six a-20s took off at 1235/I and on arriving over Guimaras Strait were given two targets by the C.S.A., "Magpie". A bemboo and cocomut grove east of atipuluan Village, target #1, was hit by two of the six airplanes with 4 x 250 lb demos and 8 x 250 lb parademos, but damage could not be determined. Two parademos failed to explode. The remaining four a-20s hit target #2, alicante Airdrome, with 5 x 250 lb demos and 16 x 250 lb parademos with nil visible damage even though all bombs hit the drome. Both targets were thoroughly strafed, but damage could not be determined. A road search was made between Silay airdrome and Guimbalaon Town with nil sightings. The search was made at the request of "Magpie". An unmanned, type 88 A/A gun was seen in the Nm dispersal loop of alicante airdrome. This was the last mission flown in March.



Late in the afternoon of 3 March 1945, First Lieutenant Richard C. Wein, 0-303722, was scratched off the list of those men reported as missing in action.

On the 21st of February, 1945, Lieutenant wein and his gunner, Sgt. Donald L. Bays, 35657740, were flying No. 2 position in the first element of six A-20G's whose mission was to attack Jesselton Airdrome, North Borneo. While enroute to the target, Lieutenant wein's right engine began to smoke and he was therefore forced to leave the formation. Soon after leaving the squadron, the engine trouble cleared up, but Lieutenant wein was unable to catch his flight. Eather than return home with bombs and ammunition, Lieutenant wein decided to attack fuerto Frincesa, Falawan, F.I., the secondary target. While making a low level attack on Fuerto Frincesa, Lieutenant wein's airplane was hit in the left engine by accurate machine gun fire coming from the old Jap row camp. The engine caught on fire and had to be feathered immediately. As the airplane could not hold altitude, Lieutenant wein was forced to make a water landing east of the target. Lieutenant bein notified Sgt. Bays that a water landing was imminent. The force of the landing was sogreat that Lieutenant wein was thrown clear of the cockpit. Sergeant Bays was apparently injured and went down with the airplane.

After spending nearly thirty-six hours in a leaky raft, Lieutenant wein finally made shore. Despite his dazed and shocked condition, he finally made contact with friendly Filipinos who escorted him to Guerrillas' headquarters. After the landing of the 41st Division on Falawan, Lieutenant wein was escorted safely to our forces and was returned to the squairon, none the worse for his trying experience. Here again, native guerrilla forces of the Fhilippine Government saved the life of an American pilot.

On the first of March, 1945, Captain George L. Cooper, 0-664533, entered the 90th Squadron on his second tour of overseas duty. Captain Cooper was formerly associated with the 499th Squadron of the 345th Bomb Group, a well known B-25 outfit. Captain Cooper served with this squadron from May 1, 1943 to February 20, 1944, during which time he participated in fifty-five combat missions, several of which, were over the vaunted Jap naval base at Rabaul, New Britain. The story of Captain Cooper's life prior to and during the war is of special interest.

Cooper's life prior to and during the war is of special interest.

Captain Cooper spent most of his life in the Philippine Islands. His father was in the export business and was affiliated with the firm of Stevens and Company, in Manila. The Cooper family, consisting of Mr. and Mrs. Cooper, a daughter eight years old, and George, lived in San Jaun Heights, a suburb of Manila. Captain Cooper left Manila in late 1939 in order to attend Mansas University. With war a definite possibility in the near future, Captain Cooper applied for aviation flight training late in 1941. Came December 7, 1941 and the subsequent Jap landings on Luzon. With no word from his family, Captain Cooper was naturally more than worried. Late in December of 1941, he received notification of his acceptance as a flying cadet. Captain Cooper entered active service in Jammary of 1942. With no news as to the fite of his family, the war with Japan had a sinister meaning for Captain Cooper. A purpose, a goal - the return to Manila. Frimary school, basic and finally advanced training. The fall of the Philippines was a known fact. Stories concerning the death march from Bataan, of the terrible atrocities committed by the Japa began to appear in the news. All Captain Cooper had left, was hope - hope perhaps that all might still be well. Graduation, gold bars and the thrill of receiving his first salute. Captain Cooper was now a pilot and at last was able to avenge his family.

May, 1943, found Captain Cooper in Fort Moresby, New Guinea. Mosquitoes, bully beef, hydraulic potatoes perhaps, but finally the one chance he had waited so long for - to take a crack at the Japs. Salamaua, Lae, Cape Gloucester and Rabaul. Captain Cooper laid manya bomb on old Tojo and with each bomb and bullet went a prayer. February of 1944, Captain Cooper received orders returning him to the United States. June of 1944, Captain Cooper received a post card. News at last. News stating that his father was in fair health and was interned in the Santo Tomas prison camp. For nearly eight months, Captain Cooper instructed student pilots in a-26 attack bombers, then came October, 1944 and the victorious return to the Philippines. Captain Cooper immediately applied for a second tour of duty in the Southwest Pacific theater. February 23, 1945, Captain Cooper arrived in the Philippines and reported to V Bomber Command. As the internees had just been released from the Santo Tomas camp, Captain Cooper was given immediate transportation to Luzon. February 24, 1945, he arrived at Santo Tomas and received the wonderful news that his family - mother, dad, and sister were all safe and were living in their own home at San Juan Heights.

The reunion of the Cooper family can never be adequately described, but sufficient to say, it is a living symbol of what we are all fighting for.

O950, March 25, 1945, an average Sunday on Mindoro Island, F.I. Some men were attending church services in the Group chapel. Engineers, Ordinance and armament personnel were on the line servicing the airplanes before the daily missions. Cooks and mechanics who had worked the previous night, were still in their sacks. Suddenly, above the usual hum drum noises, came an ominous roar of a run away airplane propeller. Directly above the camp area was a F-33 in a vertical dive coming closer and closer. All at once it seemed to stop abruptly and just disentegrate as if a giant fist had smashed it to pieces. Then came a dull explosion and an eerie whistling as pieces were hurled through the air. A parachute seemed to pop open from nowhere with a limp figure danglin, and swaying from the shrouds. Fieces of silver wing and fuschage fluttered slowly to earth. A smoking engine arched gracefully through the air, landing with a dull thud about twenty feet from a tent. The main wing and engine nacelles headed for the mess hall, missed crashing into the middle of the enlisted men's area. A flash of flame and billowing black smoke. Everyone seemed to act at once, rushing madly to the scene of the accident. M.F.s arrived and kept the crowd at a safe distance. Mater trucks were backed in, spraying insignificant jets of liquid on the crowd and tents, in an effort to keep the inferno from spreading. Mas anyone injured or killed? Rumors were flying fast, but nothing definite could be determined. Finally the fire was under control, but not before seven tents were completely destroyed.

Reports came back that one man had been killed. This was unfortunately true. The body was identified as rfc. George E. Thomas. Tommy had worked late the night before as the dispatcher in the motor pool. He had been sound asleep at the time of the accident and had not had a chance to escape. Sgt. Harold E. Stupp, Sgt. Faul J. Bosier and Cpl. George R. Fitcher received serious burns and were immediately taken to the hospital. Several other men were slightly injured and received treatment at the dispensary.

It is hard for all to realize that Tommy is no longer with us. Cheerful, short, stocky Tommy, with the unruly mop of sandy hair. The accident was doubly tragic in that Tommy had been overseas for nearly thirty-six months and was ready to return to the States on rotation. Tommy was buried at 1400 on March 26, 1945, with full military honors, and a small white cross marks his final resting place along with other veterans of the Southwest racific area.




