



COMBAT NARRATIVE

Period: 1-30 June 1945

There were but five missions flown by the 90th Squadron during the month of June because of adverse weather conditions, the closing of McGuire strip until 17 June for resurfacing, and a lack of suitable targets. Four of the five targets hit were troop concentrations, ammunition dumps, and gun positions in the Cagayan Valley, Northern Luzon. The other was a leaflet dropping mission.

A total of 39 sorties were flown during the month when 26.991 tons of bombs, 4×75 gallon napalm wing tanks, and 8×33 gallon napalm wing tanks were dropped and 62,475 rounds of .50 caliber amountain were expended.

Missions were scheduled to Piggatan, Cagayan Valley, Northern Inzon, on the 6th, 7th and 9th of the month, but were canceled due to bad weather which either closed in the route to the target or kept the airplanes on the ground altogether.

FFO 1535-4 (WF 181). The first mission in June was flown on the 2nd when nine airplanes took off from McGuire strip at C715/I to attack Naddungan Village, Northern Luzon. The 89th Squadron led the 90th and 8th Squadrons to and over the target. The nine A-20s of this squadron made one pass from west to east and a second pass from southwest to northeast, dropping 634 x 23 lb parafrags and 4 x 75 gellon napalm wing tanks. Four shacks were destroyed by direct hits and several other shacks were left burning. The target was strafed with 15,975 rounds of .50 caliver ammunition and photographs were taken with one K-17, one K-21, and one K-24 cameras. Propaganda leaflets were dropped as ordered. There was some machine gun fire from an unidentified position in the target, but none of the airplanes were damaged. A number of recently built shacks and several trails were seen in the vicinity of the target. One airplane landed at Clark Field to refuel and one A-20 from the 89th Squadron was seen to leave the formation with one propeller feathered. 36 x 25 lb parafrags were returned due to failure to release. All nine A-20s landed safely at 1145/I. *

FFO 154E-4 (F-360). At 0810/I 3 June 1945, nine A-20s took off from McGuire strip and flew to the Nassiping area, Northern Luzon, with the 8th and 13th Squadrons; this squadron was the last one over the target. One pass was made from west to east by all the airplanes and two elements made another pass from southwest to northeast. Four M10 napalm wing tanks, 84 x 100 lb, 8-15 second delay fused demos, and 14 x 250 lb, 8-15 second delay fused demos were dropped and 14,025 rounds of ammunition were expended, starting a large fire in Nassiping and two more fires east of the town. The target was missed by 6 x 100 lb, 8-15 second delay fused demos which fell into the Cagayan River. Propaganda leaflets were dropped and the attack was photographed with one type K-17 camera and one type K-24 camera. One airplane was holed just behind the bulkhead between the pilot and the bomb bay with medium anti-aircraft fire from an unidentified position in the target area and another airplane was holed in the left wing tip by machine gun fire. Two motorcycles were seen moving east of the target, ten to fifteen people were seen running for cover, and a large oil fire was seen, with smoke to 2000 feet, across the river from the town of Jones. FFO 155E-15. Three A-20s took off from McGuire strip at 9030/I on 4 June to drop propaganda leaflets on Northern Mindoro and Lubang Island. The mission was uneventful other than the dropping of sixteen bundles of leaflets along the Aglubang River, beginning at 13 $^{\circ}$ 13' north and continuing south to 12 $^{\circ}$ 55' north and sixteen bundles on the center of Lubang Island. All three airplanes landed safely at 1130/I. (1)

FFO 156E-4. The mission on 5 June 1945 was a search for artillery positions and barges near the town of Camalaniugan, Northern Luzon. Nine A-20s took off from McGuire Strip at 0815/I and were over the target from 1035/I to 1045/I, dropping 18 x 250 lb, 8-15 second delay fused demos and 36 x 250 lb, 8-15 second delay fused parademos on Camalaniugan Town. Eight shacks were destroyed, but any other damage was unobserved due to heavy smoke over the target. The target was strafed with 16,525 rounds of .50 caliber ammunition and propagands leaflets were dropped as ordered. The attack was photographed with a type K-17 camera. Several prahus, a row boat, and an unserviceable lugger were seen in the Cagayan River. The nine airplanes landed safely at 1310/I. (1) ***

FFO 160E-4 (VF352). Nine A-20s took off from McGuire strip at C755/I on 9 June 1945 to attack Jap troops and supplies at Piggatan, Cagayan Valley, but were unable to reach the target due to a solid front along the Mindoro coast. All nine airplanes landed safely at C930/I. All bombs were returned to base. (1)

FFO 169 E-4. On 18 June 1945, the day following the strip's reopening after being resurfaced with metal stripping, nine A-20s took off from McGuire strip at 0840/I to attack troops, ammunition dumps, and machine gun positions in the Cullit area of Northern Luzon. Three three-plane elements made one pass from northwest to southeast over the target and dropped 4 M10 napalm tanks, 14 x 250 lb, 8-15 second delay fused demos, and 35 x 250 lb, 8-15 second delay fused parademos and expended 15,950 rounds of .50 caliber ammunition with nil visible results. Propaganda leaflets were dropped and photographs were taken with one type K-22 camera and one type K-24 camera. Some track activity was seen near Camalaniugan Town. The S.A.P.s "Bunny" and "Nephew 4" were contacted prior to the attack. One 250 lb parademo was returned due to failure to release. This was the last mission flown during the month of June.*


SUBJECT: Monthly Summary of Events, 90th Squadron Intelligence Section.

TO : Historical Officer, 90th Bombardment Squadron (L), APO 321.

- 1. In compliance with section 7, par. 1, Memorandum 8, Hq. VBC, APO 710, dated 22 February 1945, the following summary of events and activities of the Intelligence Section for the month of June 1945, is submitted.
- 2. The Intelligence Section consists of one (1) officer and three (3) enlisted men as follows:

lst Lt. Pollard, Ambrose J., Jr. 0-585187 Intelligence Officer. S/Sgt. Cornell, Alan W., 32337060, Chief Clerk. Sgt. Hoffman, Henry E., 35638001, Clerk. Pfc. Denison, Donald L., 38542416, Clerk.

- 3. Intelligence procedure during the month of June was of a routine nature with only four combat missions being flown. Weather, the strip being closed for repair, and the lack of suitable targets were the contributing factors in the flying of so few missions.
- 4. Classes in aircraft recognition were started during the month, in order to thoroughly acquaint the combat personnel with the type airplanes they might be concerned with in future operations. The vast majority of the men have never encountered enemy planes and particular emphasis is being placed on the identification of Japanese aircraft.
- 5. A good deal of time was devoted to the preparation of target data concerning targets on the island of Kyushu. This information was disseminated to the combat crews at regular meetings and the importance of the targets was thoroughly discussed.
- 6. Pfc. Donald L. Denison continued his fine work on our files and improved the system of filing target data, information on Escape and Evasion, etc. The files on all

SUBJECT: Monthly Summary Of Events, 90th Squadron Operations Department.

- TO: Historical Officer, 90th Bombardment Squadron (L), A.P.O. 321.
- In compliance with Sec. 7, paragraph 1, Memorandum #8, HQVBC, APO 710, dated 22 February 1945, the following summary of events and activities of the Operations Department for the month of June 1945 is submitted.
 - 2. The Operations Department shows no change in its personnel.
 - 3. Combat.
- a. Five (5) combat missions were flown in the month of June with a total of 39 sorties and 187.9 combat hours.
- $\ensuremath{\text{b.}}$ One (1) airplane returned from a scheduled mission because of mechanical failure.
 - c. Our losses for the month were nil.
 - d. Two (2) aircraft suffered minor damage from enemy fire.
- e. Weather held our aircraft on the ground the latter part of the month and the quick advance of our troops up the Cagayan Valley caused missions to drop off sharply with only one mission run after the 4th of June.

4. Tactics.

- a. This Squadron led two missions out of the four conducted in the Cagayan Valley and was able to carry out the strike in the manner which it has advocated taking advantage of terrain for surprise, a minimum of three planes on a pass whenever possible, and hitting the target from more than one direction if circumstances permit, for better coverage.
- b. On one mission, reformation was Snafu and other planes endangered, when the second flight disregarded orders on making a single pass, going back in for a second pass.
 - 5. Scope of Missions.
 - a. Four missions were carried out in the Cagayan Valley. The

fifth mission was for the purpose of dropping propaganda leaflets in the Wangan Fass area, Mindoro, P.I. and on Lubang Island.

6. Training.

- a. Eleven (11) training missions were carried out for a total of 104.5 hours. Pilots were briefed on simulated targets and the missions carried out as if on an actual combat mission. Line abreast attacks were emphasized.
