

### LOCAL INTEREST

Our Base and our Functions.

To many, the address of the 90th Squadron is now, A.P.O.# 328, in care of Postmaster, San Francisco, California. To those of us here, and to our loved ones, back in the States, with whom we communicate, (now since censorship regulations have passed) A.P.O.# 328 is located at Atsugi, Honshu, Japan.

Atsugi is the name given this field because of the small town of that name four miles west of our location. Located east of the senic and ever beautiful Mt. Fuji, whose snow capped majesty is plainly visible most all the time and whose beauty is in striking contrast to the ruin and destruction and death brought on so many lands and so many of our Allies by the grinning, decieving people concieved and raised within view of that lofty peak.

Directly to the east of us about seven miles lies the battered remains of Yokahama, to the northeast about fourteen miles lies the dead shattered Japanese capitol of Tokyo.

Rechristened, after occupation, this flying field is now known as Atsugi Army Air Base.

After a few brief visits to the nearby shrines to the American ability to destroy when forced to, one is apt to wonder at the lack of damage dealt this place knowing that it, by it's proximity to places that were heavily hit, too could have easily felt the might of American airpower. Yet the only damage sustained here was not brought on by war but by time, the eventual taker of all things.

The unscathed field gives rise to speculation that our planners in their mapping of the war, must have figured that an unbombed and an operational field on Honshu would be of more value to us than to the Japanese.

\* The field went through the whole war escaping any serious damage, and now we enjoy the fruits of the effort of our tactitions in allowing it to do so.

Many outfits besides the 3rd Bombardment Group are stationed here at Atsugi. Along the ramps and taxi-ways may be seen the P-38's of the 49th Fighter Group, the Catalinas and Flying Dutchmen Fortresses of the 3rd Air- Sea Rescue Group plus P-61's, C-54's and other transport aircraft of the Air Transport Command and other Troop Carrier outfits plus an occasional Russian or British or Australian ship parked here while it's cargo of Allied officialdom is in Tokyo straightening and strengthening the cogsin the machinery of occupation and peace.

Our facilities as a Squadron are, according to the very, very few left that fall into the real veteran category, the best yet and we believe they are just that. I would go so far as to say that the quarters and comforts of this organization, through the real effort of officer and enlisted men alike, could be judged by any impartial observer as the best in all Japan using an equal amount of rank as a basis for such a decision because we understand that in cases of extreme rank the Imperial Hotel is used as a billet.

Day after day, six days a week, the hammers are flying, the saws are singing and the general sound of construction rings throughout the area. The improvements are great and the men deserve credit for the job they are doing well.

Our enlisted men have a barracks formerly occupied by the Japanese. This barracks, while not exactly a mansion, is right now the equal of most stateside Army housing facilities and when all the proposed work is finished should be very comfortable for those suffering from low-pointitis, (a disease involving in some way an eventual return to the states for cure), who will, it is proposed, be billeted here for some time to come.

The officers are billeted in another building, rather large, that houses all the officers in the group plus the officers mess hall and a movie and a yet unfinished club. The officers, as a result of hard labor on the part of a few of the men, (officers), have steam heated rooms.

Our food, while not exactly the type served at the Waldorf, has been rather good. We have our good days and our bad days and at times it's a little rough, but it doesn't take much observing of the food of the natives to convince most of us that even if it's C-ration stew it's still better than that of most of the countries and the peoples weve seen since we left the good old United States. We have our gripes, but they say you can't have an Army without them, and from the number and the types of these gripes, by that as a yardstick, we have come to the conclusion we must have a pretty good one.

Sundays, in this new era of peace which we hope will last forever, have once again been declared a holiday for all excepting a skeleton force necessary to the function of our duties here.

The foundation has been laid and the plans drawn for our remaining here at Atsugi as long as is necessary to win that peace we paid so much in blood to achieve. Inwardly, we hope there won't be too great a time involved, yet we are willing, if necessary, to stay till that job is finished, provided, that when we do finally leave, we can go knowing that it won't be necessary for us or our children to ever again look to Atsugi as an enemy stronghold to be battered down, but rather as a spot in a peaceful land wherein we completed our assignment in the manner it was planned to be done to insure a real and lasting peace.

THAGE ZIPPO, Atsugi's own Air-Ground Rescue Team

Japan, especially this part in the vicinity of atsugi Airstrip, is especially fortunate in having some of the best year round weather for flying of any other country in these parts. The mountains to the north and west of us shelter this particular area to a great degree from the intense weather usually found lying along the northern coast and the western shores of the island of Honshu. But, as to all areas bordered by so much water, Atsugi has it's share of weather too. To combat these unpredictable surges of bad weather and to insure more safe landings on this heavily loaded air traffic terminal is the duty and function of Image Zippo.

To most, Image Zippo are just two words with no connected train of thought, leaving the hearer with the impression that the speaker is suffering from a bad case of Ilanditis or some such malady, brought on by extended overseas service that slowly deteriorates the brain tissue, but upon investigation one will find the two words to be tactical code call signs used today in the Air Forces.

Image, if one takes the trouble to investigate, is the coded call sign for the tower here at Atsugi. Zippo the accredited code name for G.C.A. Therefore Image Zippo is in lay terms the Ground Controlled Approach system installed here at Atsugi Army Air Base, Honshu, Japan.

Ground Controlled Approach is exactly as it's name implies a method of controlling from the ground the approach of any aircraft in flight within aradius of thirty miles under four thousand feet altitude to insure a safe landing in the poorest of weather.

In order that we might get a first hand picture of what makes G.C.A. tick we took a trip down to the line to the trailer that houses the unit. Our explanation, to follow, is not to be construed as atechnical one but rather from a laymans point of view. We are not primarily interested in what makes the blip on the cathode tube but we are rather interested in what that blip means to the observer trying to effect a safe landing when either our friends or ourselves are depending on him to bring us safely through the weather to a completed mission.

G.C.A. is housed in an airconditioned trailer just to the west of the runway. To those as yet unindoctrinated in the latest methods and uses of radar, might appear the feeling of being in the nest of some fiendish mad-men with the sweep scopes running, the hum of the power plant and the eerie glow of the cathode test tube giving that impression. The unit is operated by a highly skilled team of five men all technitians and radar mechanics. Five men whose duty it is, to you as a pilot, to bring you safely through the weather from a trailer with no windows except the all-seeing eye of radar. Let us investigate as to how these five men propose to use their equipment to bring about your safe return.

First off, we have two operators running identical search scopes. There are two of these to allow the G.C.A. team to work more than one aircraft at the same time. This scope, which will pick up any airplane within a thirty mile radius provided that this airplane is under four thousand feet, is super-imposed on a map of the area. Every sweep of the scope will reveal the aircrafts relative position from the set. This set or scope has three ranges, thirty miles, fifteen miles, and a seven and a half mile scope to allow closer scrutiny as the plane approaches nearer the field. The assigned duty of this operator is to find the aircraft on the scope and by radio communication bring it on a heading that will bisect the width of the runway.

Another sweep scope is operated in such a manner that after the aircraft has been found by the first operator and is already on a heading that will bring him over the runway the second scope will picture the airplane and show it's vertical position in feet above the ground. The duty of this operator is , again by radar, to bring the aircraft down a predetermined glide path to within fifty feet of the runway.

By the operators of these two scopes tracking the position of the aircraft at all times, the final controller literally talks the pilot down using as his guide the error meter that shows error in degrees laterally and in feet vertically reading the error from the prescribed heading and glide path from the scopes of the first two operators.

That is G.C.A., another Air Force development that men may fly when the birds walk.

When the weather is bad our own Image Zippo has a big job on it's hands. That that job has been done well is attested by the fact that as yet weather has not caused a single fatality in our area since the arrival of Ground Controlled Approach.

Truly Image Zippo is Atsugi's own Ground - Air Rescue Team.

- 3. The biggest change in the squadron for the month of November was the departure of high point men and the arrival of replacements. All men with an adjusted service rating score of 65 points, A through M, and over, have left the organization for return to the United States for discharge.
- 4. A number of men were affected by Group Personnel action in the computation of adjusted service rating scores. Previously, some men had been given point credit, erroneously, for time served in the Enlisted Reserve Corps. Upon inspection of the records by Group Personnel clerks, it was discovered 31 men from this organization had errors causing the loss of from 1 to 9 points in the computation of their adjusted service rating scores.

- 5. Improvements are being made in the Enlisted Mens barracks by the addition of a cieling and the installation of gas heat. The work is being done by Japanese workers, supervised by army personnel.
